Experience Vietnam



Vietnam is a country in the shape of an “S,” located in the heart of Southeast Asia, on the eastern side of the Indochinese Peninsula, with a coastline stretching 3,260 km. It is renowned for its rich natural beauty, from Ha Long Bay, Trang An, Son Doong Cave to Phu Quoc Island. The country also boasts a diverse and unique culture with 54 ethnic groups, reflected in traditions, costumes, and




culinary styles. Visitors will be warmly welcomed by the gentle and hospitable Vietnamese people, while enjoying delicious and distinctive dishes such as pho, bun cha, banh xeo, as well as a wide variety of tropical fruits.

Quang Ninh



Ha Long Bay, recognized by UNESCO and listed as one of the New 7 Wonders of Nature, is home to 1,969 islands and islets, most of which are limestone formations with an extensive cave system. Each island possesses its own unique charm, featuring famous sites such as Sung Sot Cave, Thien Cung Grotto, Trinh Nu Cave, Dau Go Cave, Me Cung Cave, Titop Island, and Ba Trai Dao Beach... The striking shapes and colors of the islands, harmoniously blending with the sky and sea, create a magnificent watercolor-like masterpiece.

Coc Sau is the deepest open-pit coal mine in Southeast Asia that is still in operation. Covering just over 4 square kilometers, it descends steeply into the earth, with a dramatic spiral road winding up and down the mine. The narrow, towering walls of the pit create sharp turns and near-vertical inclines, navigable only by ultra-heavy-duty vehicles such as HD or Volvo trucks - each weighing tens of tons and equipped with tires nearly two meters tall.



Yen Tu is the cradle of the Truc Lam Zen sect—an indigenous Buddhist school deeply rooted in Vietnamese spiritual and cultural identity. Rising approximately 1,068 meters above sea level, Yen Tu is renowned for its majestic landscapes, sacred mountains, and year-round mist that create a mystical, spiritual atmosphere. In addition to its ancient pagodas and towers, Yen Tu captivates visitors with its rich primeval forest ecosystem, centuries-old pine tree paths, and a modern cable car system that makes the pilgrimage to the summit more accessible.
